

### DIRECTIONS TO ROCKY NOOK BOWLING CLUB

The Rocky Nook Bowling Club's Pavilion is not hard to find. As shown on the sketch map, it is just inside the entrance to Fowlds Park from New North Road, Mt. Albert. Fowlds Park lies in the area (roughly triangular in shape) bounded by New North Road, Western Springs Road and Asquith Avenue. The entrance from New North Road is only about 50 yards on the city side of the overhead Railway Bridge which crosses New North Road and is impossible to miss.

You can get to Fowlds Park from any point of the compass:- From the City - Via Symonds Street and New North Road; From Remuera, Epsom, etc.- Via Greenlane, Balmoral Road and St. Luke's Road; From Western Springs and Grey Lynn - Via Western Springs Road and Asquith Avenue (use Asquith Ave. entrance to Park); From Pt. Chevalier and N.W. Motorway - Via Carrington Road and New North Road.



Is that quite clear? Sorry we did not have the I Section around to draw a decent map but then some of us could never follow their maps anyway.

Better get a peep at a street map and find Fowlds Park and you're home and hosed.

#### ANNUAL REPORT

FACTS AND FIGURES: Being a cautious type, the Treasurer has been expecting to finish up with a deficit each year for some time past but has just managed to keep outof the red by reason of some unexpected donations and a small profit here and there. on social functions. This year it has happened - we have spent \$51 more than our income. You can see what occurred from the enclosed Financial Statement. In part, the old story - too many unfinancial members. About a third of our members have not not yet paid their \$1 subs for 1969/70. Also, we lost money on social functions. We over-estimated the numbers likely You never know how many will show up until it's too late to let the caterers know. There was that Ladies Night when so many came the food was a bit light, but this year we had tone of food but not enough people at both the Ladies Night in Hamilton and the Annual Reunion. You can't pick a night to suit everyone and you can't estimate the toll of winter ailments. You can't do anything about those who forget to book in, or those who book in and then forget. It's going to be different in the coming year. It will have to be.

BRANCH WELFARE FUND: Again this fund has been well supported. Donations were just over \$50. Expenditure exceeded this but we have a reasonable reserve. As members grow older calls on the fund can be expected to increase.

CRETE FUND: We reported on the Crete Kids in our last issue. The two remaining sponsorships will end during the coming year. Can we sponsor another child? We have \$111 in the kitty. The Annual Meeting can decide that one!

BEER FOR WHISKY COMPANY: The Vietnam War - to be or not to be - is a hot topical issue, and not for us to decide. N.Z. troops are there, and their morale (as did ours in 1939/40) depends a lot on the support theyget from home. A group of old soldiers in Auckland has been sending consignments of canned beer to the boys in Vietnam. The beer, free of duty, is ridiculously cheap and free transport is provided by a sister Service. Your Committee decided to send such a consign-Just how much it was appreciated is shown by the following extracts from a letter from the O.C., Whisky Coy.

"As you may have heard, our Battalion spent Christmas Day in the field and we therefore held our celebrations on New Years Day. This consisted of the traditional Xmas Dinner served by Officers and Senior N.C.O.s. I can assure you that your gift was appreciated by all and everyone had a memorable day.
